Welcome to Your 'Situation Table Participants' Learning Site

This is a practical course offering - and ongoing resource site - that will provide in-depth training for a thorough understanding of the Situation Table - how it fits in the broader concepts of Community Safety and Well-Being (CSWB), how it navigates within privacy protocols, the Four Filters, and the table operations - and is designed to support you and your local Table colleagues as you set out to launch and operate your local Situation Table in the weeks and months ahead.

The first thing you may have noticed is our use of the term Situation Table, in place of the term more familiar to the Boston area, inspired by the first Chelsea Hub, and in turn, by the original Prince Albert Hub in Saskatchewan. Experience since the 2015 Chelsea adoption, and in similar sites across Canada and the US, has shown that the 'Hub' label can be problematic given the proliferation of other community collaborative solutions using a similar name ... but actually very different in purposes and intents from this Hub or Situation Table model. Rest assured, your training and resources here are very much keyed to the Chelsea model, as well as those deployed since in East Boston, Jamaica Plain, Worcester, Plymouth and others.

This course utilizes the asynchronous components presented here in the menu to the left, as well as interactive on-site learning sessions led by your local mentors, to ensure you are fully informed and prepared in the lead-up to local Situation Table adoption.

These individuals have volunteered their time and passion to develop a deep understanding of the Situation Table and its underlying CSWB foundations, and to share widely the success of the model. They are serving as the local guidance and support team to ensure that your Table is well-prepared for ongoing fidelity and sustainability. We commend them for their dedication, and we can say with confidence that they are ready, proficient and able to lead you through all phases in the Table's adoption.

To help you navigate this module we have outlined below the 'breakdown' of the course, identified 'who this is for', and listed the 'learning goals'. You will see in the breakdown that the first section is the **Introduction/Welcome which begins here**.

Post-Launch Mentoring Support for Model Fidelity

A few days before the launch date, it will be important that you are prepared and ready.

Table learners should, at this time, be starting the Filter 1 (F1) process internal to your respective agencies and then developing their Filter 2 (F2) read-in notes for any real situations in the community that, in your view, may rise to the level of AER. Sometimes, you may be hesitant or unsure about bringing situations forward as this is new. The Four Filters will guide your Table through its approach and ensure that only situations that meet the threshold will go through to Filter 3 (F3).

Table Members are asked to notify their Table Chair that they have an F1 situation ready to be introduced at an upcoming Table session.

Please note, however, not to disclose any details of these situations before entering the secure environment of the Table. Only share that you have (or don't have) a Situation to bring forward. Once the meeting begins, under the guidance of the Chair, you will then be invited to introduce yourself and the new situation.

Table Meetings will always occur as per the established local schedule. The Situation Table must not be dependent upon prior identification of new situations as there may be report-backs and ongoing issues to address, and F1 situations can often emerge right up to the start and commencement of any meeting.
