Learner Challenges

A Strictly Peer-Support Relationship

Trainer and learners are “accountable” to their home organizations for successful outcomes. At the table, all participating members, mentors, and stakeholders are essentially accountable “only to the community.” Table participants must learn to responsibly perform their roles at the table while satisfying their agency role.



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Learning, Unlearning, and Building Trust at the Table

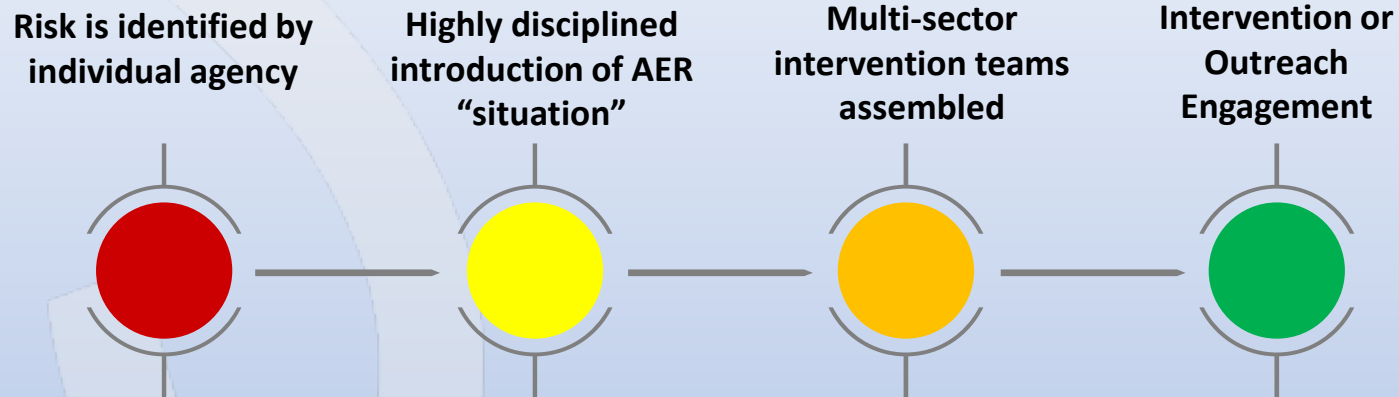
At the table, there is often much to unlearn”. Everyone comes from unique workplaces with some common features. Territorial instincts run deep (“turf battles”), which can tend to emerge early and quickly in new tables. Building trust between agencies that may not typically work with one another is vital to success.

Filter 4 – Planning and Intervention

- Happens after a general session of the Situation Table meeting
- Only agencies assigned during the table discussion are involved
- Agencies will meet and plan for intervention within 24 - 48 hours

Group Exercise

Day 2: Mock Situation Presentation Scenario - In preparation for Day 2, you will work together in groups to prepare presented “situations” that you could envision bringing to the Situation Table.

* Do not use any actual situations so as to potentially accidentally share PII

If you provide a “resource packet” as part of the outreach engagement, please bring those materials to enhance the mock scenario.

Group Exercise Parameters

Create a Situation with a range of 4 to 7 Risk Factors (no more for simplicity in conducting a Mock scenario with the Data Recorder entering information)

Groups will be assigned either an Individual or Family Situation

Create a Situation that will cross at least four (4) stakeholder agencies (those agencies must have someone in the training that can role play that agency role on Day 2)

For the Mock scenario, provide information that there is recognition by at least one of the Table participating agencies

Use the F1 form for creating your Mock scenario. For training purposes only. Do not use any real PII, actual situations and/or real addresses, etc. Bring forward Risk Factors that you recognize within your jurisdiction.
